



## Dundonnell Wind Farm COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION

The Tilt Renewables team is about to commence construction of the \$560 million Dundonnell Wind Farm located approximately 23km north-east of Mortlake, in the Western District of Victoria. Work by AusNet Services on the transmission line, is also about to commence.

There will be over 200 jobs created during the construction phase, many of those jobs will be filled locally.

Tilt Renewables is on track to commence the construction of the Woorndoo-Streatham Rd upgrade this week.

Tilt Renewables' subcontractors, Vestas and Zenvion, have taken up a temporary office in Mortlake, where they will remain until the site facilities are established.

Large machinery, including earthmoving equipment, and a small shed, (associated with the road upgrade) will be delivered to the southern section of Woorndoo-Streatham Road. Site establishment activities including the quarry and some access tracks will commence soon after.

In the next few weeks the construction of the transmission line will really begin to get underway. You will see an increase in families and workers moving into the area. You will also see more cars branded Downer and AusNet Services doing visits along the transmission corridor.

The project teams are working closely with landowners and other stakeholders to ensure they share information about the up and coming construction works, as well as scheduling works to minimise impacts on cropping and grazing activities where possible.
